I would like to start a policy that after District Convention, the President reviews the list of Chapters that were unable to attend and had a proxy sitting for them. The President would then check in with that Chapter and make sure that everything is okay and open that line of communication to see why they were unable to attend. I want to make sure that what happens at District events is communicated to everyone and not just those who attended. To do this, I will continue to use Facebook and email as the primary means of communication, as well as finding ways to keep all Chapters involved, such as presenting virtual workshops that were held at District events. The information presented during workshops should always be available to Brothers and making sure that everyone has equal access is important to our success.

It is important that all Brothers in the District feel as though they have a voice and I plan to make myself as easily accessible as possible. Once a month, I plan to meet with the SEDAA board and update them as to what is going on within the district. I feel as though keeping the Alumni in the loop is also pertinent to the success of the District. I want to make check in with them and make sure that their needs are being met and I want to plan with them to make sure that their programming fits well with what is being planned for convention. In addition to this, I would like to work with the VPP and VPM about adding at least one Alumni workshop at DLC/MER, as well as starting a Mentorship Program

between SEDAA and the Active Brothers to help with a smoother transition from Active to Alumni, especially for Brothers who graduate prior to District Convention.
